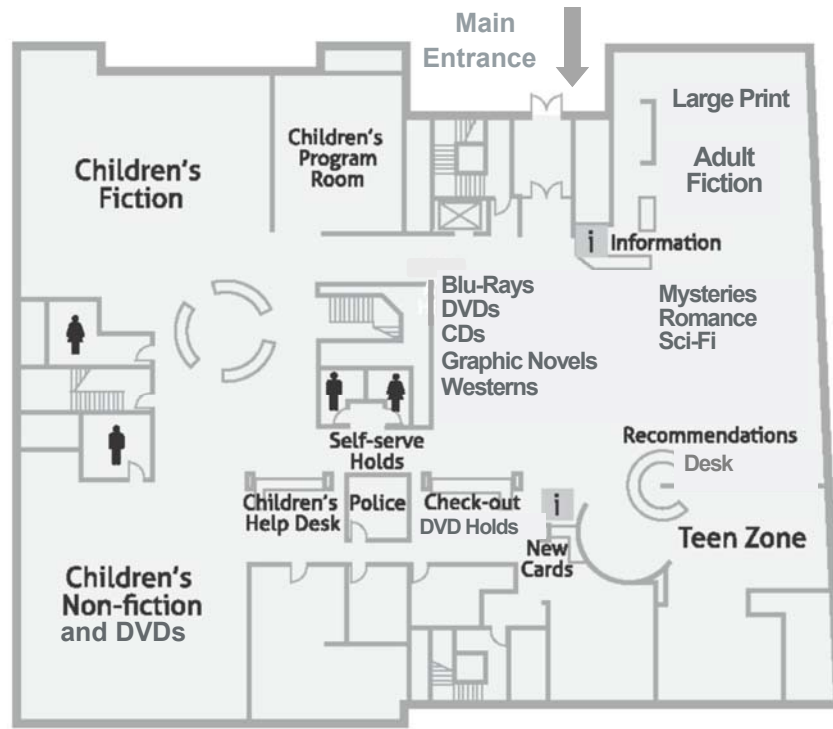
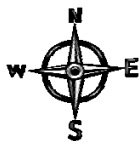
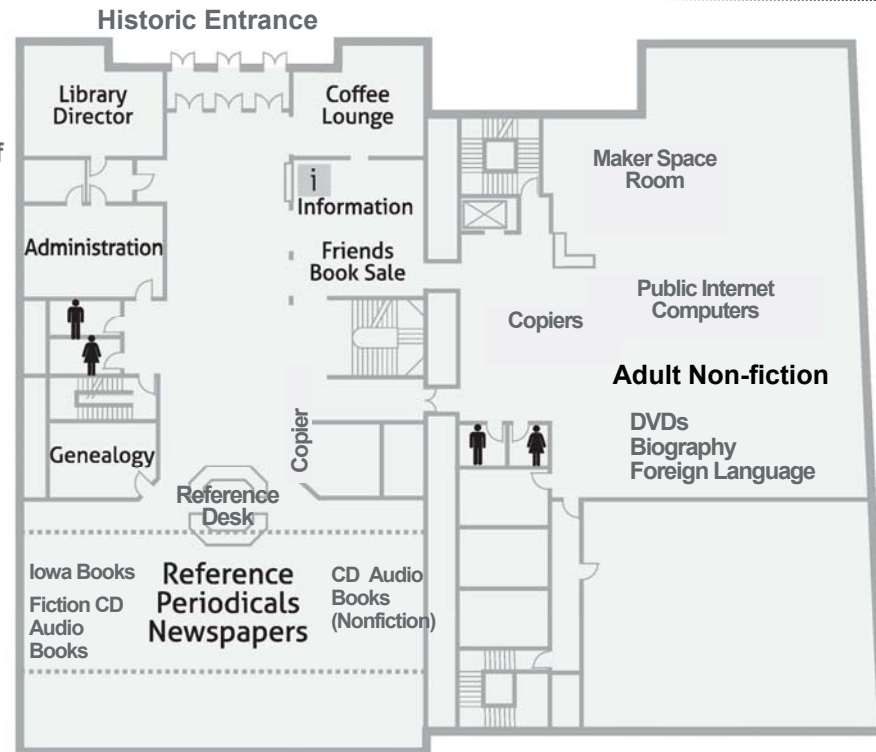


First Floor Map of the Library

LIBRARY CARDS

Any individual living within the Dubuque city limits may receive a library card free of charge. The Library may ask for a \$1.00 donation to help defray the cost of the card.

- Residents of Iowa who have a current library card from their town of residence may be eligible for a limited service library card.
- Out-of-town residents and those with home libraries in Iowa may be eligible to purchase a library card. Inquire at the Circulation Desk.
- Residents of communities in Dubuque County without a library should inquire at the Circulation Desk.
- Visitor's library card; \$10.00/month limited to 3 items. No internet use.
- Visitor's Internet access card; \$52.00/year, \$26.00/6 months, \$13.00/3 months.

To get a library card, applicants are required to provide valid identification (driver's license or birth certificate and social security card) and proof of residence (voting card, utility bill, recently postmarked mail, or a check with an imprinted address). If the applicant has no proof of address, a postcard can be mailed to the residence and then brought to the library. The library does not accept a post office box address or college box address when applying for a library card.

Children under the age of 16 must have a parent or guardian's signature to receive a library card.

BORROWING MATERIALS

A valid library card or photo I.D. must be presented to borrow materials. Full access library cardholders may borrow up to 100 items including books, magazines, CDs and CD Audiobooks; up to five (5) DVDs; up to two (2) Books-to-Go; and two (2) DVDs-to-Go.

Books-to-Go, DVDs-to-Go, Interlibrary Loan materials and juvenile holiday books are not renewable. Items on hold for another patron may not be renewed. Items may be renewed only once.

Pre-notification of items coming due, reserves being held, or notice of overdue items, can be provided by e-mail. Please provide your e-mail address at the Circulation Desk.

Text-Messaging Notification System is now available for patrons to receive notification of account information, including holds and overdue items. Inquire at the Circulation Desk for more information.

TeleCirc, the Library's telephone circulation system, calls patrons when their reserved items are available and when materials are overdue. To renew materials, patrons may dial TeleCirc at (563) 589-0887. Enter the barcode on the back of your library card when requested.

RETURNING MATERIALS

Materials may be returned to the following locations:

- Inside the Library during open hours.
- The walk-up 24-hour return boxes outside the Library's main entrance or drive-up boxes on Bluff Street.
- The 24-hour return boxes at Eleanor Roosevelt Middle School, 2001 Radford Road and Asbury Plaza Hy-Vee, Northwest Arterial.
- The return boxes at the customer service desk at the Kennedy Mall, 555 J. F. Kennedy Road, available during regular Mall hours.

MAKER SPACE

The Library's Maker Space is a place with a focus on creation - everything from music and videos to 3D printing and jewelry making and more! The Maker Space provides an area for collaborative learning and creativity as well as accommodates individuals.

YOUTH SERVICES

Youth Services provides materials appropriate for children of all ages. This diverse collection contains board books, picture books, easy readers, fiction, nonfiction, and reference books in print and non-print formats.

The Teen Zone provides a collection of books, CDs, magazines, audiobooks, and computers for young adults.

Many programs are held regularly. A complete activity schedule may be found in the Youth Services Department and on the Library's web page. Childcare providers, preschools, and elementary school teachers are encouraged to inquire about tours and story times.

ADULT SERVICES

Adult Services staff the **Reference Desk** on 2nd floor and the **Recommendations Desk** on 1st floor. Inquiries and requests for information may be made in person, by telephone to (563) 589-4225, or by e-mail to yourlibrarian@dubuque.lib.ia.us. Adult Services offers book discussions, programs, computer classes, and movie nights.

Contact the **Reference Desk** for assistance in answering research questions, finding newspapers and magazines, as well as nonfiction, genealogy and Iowa Book materials. Staff can show you how to use the Library's online catalog, databases, downloadable materials, word processors, listening and viewing stations, copiers and microfilm reader-printers.

Visit the **Recommendations Desk** for reading, viewing, and listening suggestions. Staff can help you find new authors, place holds, and make requests for purchase or Interlibrary Loan. Interlibrary Loan requests have a \$3.00 charge to offset postage for each request that is filled, with a limit of three items at one time.

Genealogy and Local History sources include a local obituary index, local newspapers and census data on microfilm, online newspapers and databases such as Ancestry.com and Heritage Quest. Encyclopedia Dubuque is also available online at www.encyclopediaDubuque.org.

COPIERS

Black-and-white and color coin-operated photo-copiers are available. Black-and-white copies are \$0.10 each and \$0.15 for double sided copies. Color copies are \$0.50 per 8.5 x 11 inch sheet. There is an extra charge for 11 x 17 inch sheet copies.

Scanning text and images up to size 11 x 17 inch sheet is \$0.10 for each page. **Laminating** is \$1.50 per foot.

FAX MACHINE

Fax services for sending and receiving faxes are available at the **New Cards Desk**. The number for the fax machine is (563) 589-4306. Fees charged are as follows:

- Incoming or outgoing local or 800 numbers \$0.25/page.
- Incoming or outgoing long distance numbers \$1.00 for the first page, \$0.50/page thereafter.

INTERNET

The Library requires that those using the Internet have an account in good standing. Printing is \$0.10/black-and-white page, \$0.15/black-and-white double sided page, and \$0.50/color page. Inquire at the Information Desk about Internet Guest cards.

Library materials may also be searched, reserved, and renewed via the Library's website.

NON-PRINT COLLECTIONS

The library has available Blu-ray's, DVDs, music CDs, books-on-CD and MP3 audiobooks in the Adult and Youth Services Collections.

Digital Collections are available on the library's website and include downloadable materials, e-Audio, e-Books, magazines, comics and streaming video.

Research databases offered include a variety of in depth resources such as genealogy, learning languages, small business reference center, investments, home improvement and repair, auto and small engine repair to mention some.

The Library subscribes to databases offering subject specific documents and articles from magazines and journals. There are educational, training and tutoring resources, that are also available through database access.

Listening and viewing stations are available for all media. Headsets are required and may be purchased at the Circulation Desk.

AUTHOR ALERT SERVICE

Complete a web form and you will be notified by email or text message when your favorite author, performer, or film studio has a work soon to be added to the collection.

MAGAZINES AND NEWSPAPERS

The Library subscribes to over 500 magazines and newspapers for adults and children. Most magazines may be checked out for one week with one renewal unless on reserve for another patron. Current issues cannot be checked out. Magazines and newspapers are also available online.
