## Obituary Archive Search

We are continuously in the process of adding to this database and it will eventually cover the period of 1868 - present. This process will take time, and the information that we are inputting is arranged alphabetically, not chronologically. So if you do not find the obituary you are looking for check back periodically.

Your results will not return the actual obituary - but rather the individual's name, date the obituary ran in the newspaper and the page, the city they were from, the date of death (not always available). If you wish to have a copy of the obituary, you will be able to submit this order online and a PDF version of the obituary will be e-mailed to you. There will be a fee of \$10.00 for reprint orders.
